One set of the following questions must be answered: Check the box beside the question if the answer is yes.

- If acquiring a pig from instate seller/breeder:
  - At pickup, are the pig(s) listed above, been residents of the state of West Virginia for at least 14 days and are isolated from pigs that are not residents of the state of WV for at least 14d?
  - Do the pig(s) listed above come from a seller that is considered to have a PED (porcine epidemic diarrhea) AND swine influenza free premise?
  - If the breeder and the seller are different, is the breeder considered to have a PED AND swine influenza free premise?
- If the pigs listed above are from an out of state breeder or seller:
  - Is there a certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI or health certificate) from a licensed federal veterinarian that states, "The pigs listed above come from a Porcine Epidemic Diarrhea (PED) virus free premise and are not exposed to PED within last 30d"?
  - Is this same premise considered swine influenza free?
  - Does your pig have a state/federal or premise Identification tag?

*If any of the above questions are answered with the response NO, then those pigs **may not** be eligible for entrance into the Tyler County Fair market hog and breeder swine show. Please contact a Fair representative for more clarification*

- **Are the pigs listed above vaccinated for swine influenza and/or PED?  
If yes, please complete the table found on back**
- **Are the pigs listed above intended to be used as feeder/market animals?**

Considerations for the pigs:

- 1) **Weigh-in for the pigs is Friday May 17th, 2019 from 6-8 pm.**
- 2) **All market pigs must be LIVING in West Virginia AND in possession of the exhibitor by May 3rd, 2019.**
- 3) Recommended birthdate range of the market pig is to be the middle of February to the middle of March of the same year as the fair.
- 4) Recommended weight at pickup or acquisition
  - a. This weight is for a pig that can gain 1.5-2.0 pounds/day in order to be around 100# by May 1<sup>st</sup>.
    - i. Other weight considerations:
      1. Weight should be between 40-60 pounds on April 1, 2019.
      2. Weight should be between 88-128 pounds by May 1, 2019.
      3. Weight should be around 240 pounds or heavier by July 30, 2019.
      4. **Maximum** weight at initial weigh-in is **172 pounds**.
      5. **Required minimum** weight to enter the fair is **200 pounds**
    - ii. Any other sized pigs will have difficulty in making Fair week weights.
      1. Most pigs gain less weight during the summer months due to heat and humidity because they do not eat when it is hot/humid.
      2. Average daily weight gain through the summer months is usually around 1.25-1.5#/day. If the average summer growth period is 60 days, average total weight gain/pig is around 70-90 pounds.
      3. **There is no maximum weight restriction on pigs that enter the Tyler County fair. There is a minimum weight restriction to enter the Tyler County fair so it is better to get a bigger pig than a smaller one if you want to guarantee your spot in the Market swine competition.**
