## **Entries Accepted in Log Building on:**

Sunday 1:00 – 5:00pm & Monday 9:00am-12:00pm

1. All exhibits must be clean and not previously exhibited at the Fair.
2. Junior Fair entries under ART, FLOWERS and HORTICULTURE will be entered with adult exhibits.
3. Only 10 exhibits per individual with one (1) entry per class or subplot.
4. Work must be done by exhibitor.
5. All items will be judged on merit.
6. Premium money must be picked up by 10:30 on Saturday of the Fair.
7. All exhibits must be picked up by Sunday following the Fair, 9:00am – 2:00pm.
8. Baked goods will not be auctioned off.
